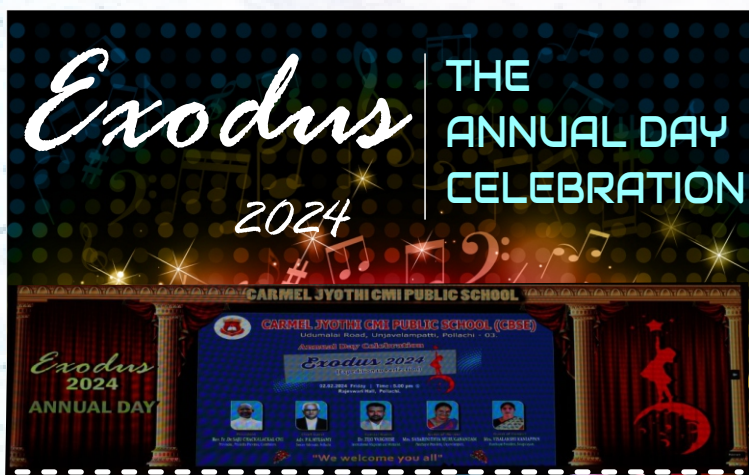

Examples: Sentence without interjections

A **primary** interjection is a word or sound that can only be used as an interjection.

Examples: Ugh! That's disgusting.

A **secondary** interjection is a word that is typically used as another part of speech

Examples: Shoot! My flight has been cancelled

A **volitive** interjection is used to give a command or make a request.

Examples: Shh! I can't focus when you're singing.

An **emotive** interjection is used to express an emotion or to indicate a reaction to something.

Examples: Yay! I'm so excited to see you.

A **cognitive** interjection is used to express a thought or indicate a thought process.

Examples: Eureka! I've solved the puzzle.
