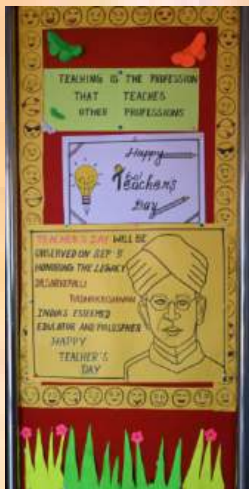

IMPORTANT FACTS ABOUT BIRDS

1. Birds have hollow bones: Unlike mammals, birds have hollow bones that help reduce their weight and make flight more efficient.
2. There are over 10,000 bird species: According to the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), there are approximately 10,072 different bird species in the world.
3. The fastest bird on record is the peregrine falcon: The peregrine falcon can reach speeds of up to 389 km/h (242 mph) during its characteristic hunting dive, known as a stoop.

Homophones, homographs, and homonyms are words that are related in different ways:

- **HOMOPHONES**

Words that sound the same but have different meanings. For example, "bear" and "bare".

- **HOMOGRAPHS**

Words that are spelled the same but have different meanings. For example, "bow" (a curved weapon for shooting arrows) and "bow" (to bend forward at the waist).

- **HOMONYMS**

Words that sound alike or are spelled alike but have different meanings. Homonyms can be homophones, homographs, or both. For example, "lie" can mean "not true" or "horizontal or resting position".

Here are some more examples of homophones, homographs, and homonyms:

- **HOMOPHONES:** "Knew" and "new" or "meat" and "meet"

- **HOMOGRAPHS:** "Park" (a public play area) and "park" (to bring a vehicle to a stop and leave it temporarily)

- **HOMONYMS:** "Plain" and "plane"

To avoid confusion, it's important to pay attention to the context in which a word is used to determine its intended meaning.

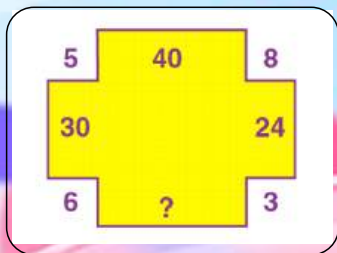

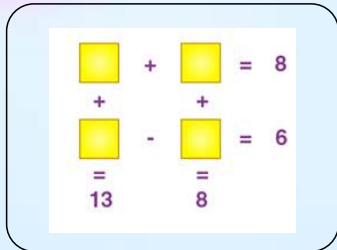

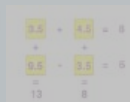
