## TIME MANAGEMENT

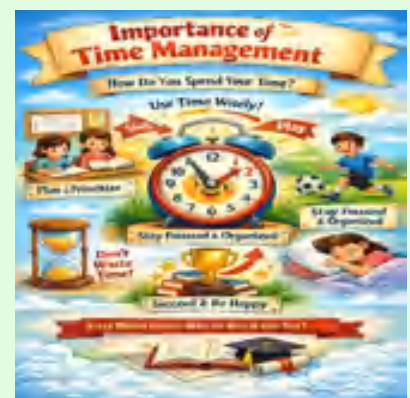

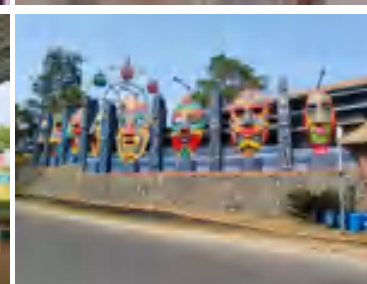
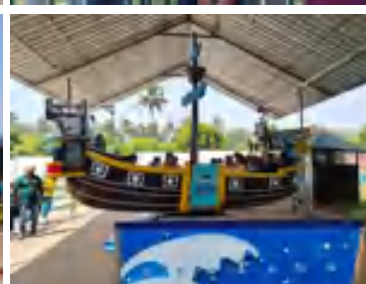
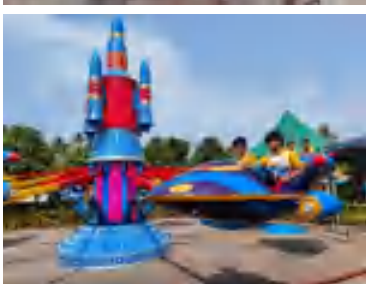
## EDUCATIONAL TOUR TO
